Thank you for your ongoing faithful support of our ministry to the people of Papua New Guinea through Bible translation. Thank you especially for your prayers and for the donation you sent in May.

Some exciting things have been happening, which we'd like to share with you.

In our last update we mentioned that Steve would be checking the book of Revelation for the Migabac translation team. This happened in May. It was the final book of their New Testament, which they will publish and launch in 2019. Steve has been invited to attend the dedication.



Steve also participated with a group of colleagues to do final formatting corrections for the Mato New Testament, which will also be published next year.

Steve has been preparing to do a thorough consultant check of the Gizra books of Romans, 1 Corinthians, Philippians, and James, which will happen next month. He will then prepare to check 1-2 Corinthians for the Kaluli translation team. That checking session will be in November.

Last week Steve attended a seven-day Greek Refresher course. Although he has had extensive training in Greek, it was good to revisit the important topics which help to better align our translations accurately with the original text.

Carol Jean recently completed her first semester of teaching grade 2. It was an enjoyable challenge to re-employ her teaching skills in the classroom after 27 years. Teaching at the school enables translators and other missionaries to continue their work without sacrificing their children's education. There were also four Papua New Guinean students in her class. She will be preparing for another year of teaching after a five-week "summer" school break.



School break will include something much more exciting than preparing for the new school year. We are looking forward to a two-week visit from Adam and Lizzy beginning on Monday, June 18th! It will be fun to show Lizzy where Adam grew up. Earlier this month they celebrated their first wedding anniversary. We haven't seen them in person since just after their wedding.

Praise God for the progress that was made in translation work and in furthering the education of the children of missionaries and of others.

Thank you for your prayers and offerings. They are very important to us.

The situation in Nicaragua has become even more critical and serious. The death toll has increased, the number of injured is now in the thousands, several cities lack food and supplies, and thousands have lost their jobs. The following is a quote from the U.S. Embassy travel advisory:

"Rallies and demonstrations are widespread and occur daily with little notice. In many instances the government responds using tear gas, pepper spray, rubber bullets, and live ammunition, leading to significant numbers of deaths and injuries. Looting, vandalism, and acts of arson often occur during unrest, including in tourist areas. The perpetrators are often government-controlled thugs in civilian clothing, sometimes using vehicles without license plates. Government authorities detain protesters, and many people have disappeared. Human rights groups have documented credible claims of torture of detainees

Please pray for God to intervene in this situation. We are in daily contact with our pastors, leaders and friends all over Nicaragua while we are here, to receive accurate news and to pray with and encourage them in this difficult time.

We can clearly see how God took us out of Nicaragua before the violence started in order to protect us while all this was happening. We give thanks for that.

This month was one of travel for us. After visiting my parents in Hibbing, we attended our daughter Kelsy's graduation from Youth With a Mission in Redding, CA. She learned so much in her Discipleship School and in her 6 weeks ministering in Turkey. Our son Luke, who is now on staff in the Music Department of the YWAM base in Montana, also drove to be there. So it was nice to be with 3 of our children together for a few days.

Now we are on our way to TX, where we will see our son Judah, visit Earl's brother, and connect with our mission base. Then we will drive to NC for a conference the last week of June. We will have logged about 7000 miles before we return to Nicaragua.

Pray for safe travels, provisions for our journey, good connections with people, and a time for rest and renewal during the rest of our time in States.

We started with babies in cloth diapers in a tent in 1969. Then went from pop ups, to travel trailers, a
