We are amazed at how much the staff has done while we were gone, we can truly say that more has happened this year while we were at home in the U.S. than any other year. It is amazing!

The clinic remains packed with people, teaching is going on, and things are moving forward.

We arrived to see our 4 new puppies which are 3 months old now. They are huge and oh so adorable! They are going to dwarf their parents I am thinking, we are training them to be guard dogs for other areas of the compound.

Please pray that we will hear clearly God's direction on how to move forward with the hospital, community outreach, and the technical training program. Sept. 2 our next group of students will start their business classes and another group will start their preparatory classes. It is rainy season, so a little cooler, and things are growing and blooming, but the Son is shining brightly!

He has been told to be very careful because the government police have "ears" everywhere to arrest anyone who makes any negative comment against it.

Bev is getting Kelsy settled into the dorm for her first year at John Brown University in Siloam Springs, AR. It's hard to believe that we only have one left at home now.

Next week Bev and Esperanza will travel to MN and help her parents downsize and move to Elk River to be close to her younger brother, as they can no longer manage on their own. They signed the papers to sell their house in Hibbing. There Florida house is also on the market.

Earl will travel for 2 weeks in September to minister in Spain and Germany. At the end of September all of our family will gather in Austin, TX to celebrate the wedding of our son Judah and his lovely bride-to-be Leila. We are so excited to have Leila join our family.

Please pray with us that the political situation will be resolved so that we will be able to return to Nicaragua after the wedding. There are tremendously multiplied needs there now with the trauma of so much violence, the grief of so many who lost loved ones, the severe economic lack, and the ever-present fear of death, torture, or imprisonment by the present government that has become a dictatorship like Venezuela.
