Steve and Carol Jean

As a translation consultant for the past 21 years, Steve has checked Scripture for 41 languages, amounting to 917 Bible chapters. Those languages represent a total population of over half a million people!

Together with you, we are continuing to work toward eradicating Bible poverty.

In February Steve finished consultation with the Etulo team in Nigeria on their book of Hebrews. During the consultation, he also mentored three consultant trainees, two of whom are Nigerian pastors. He is also working remotely with the Saliba team in Papua New Guinea, checking their translation of Luke and Romans.

Steve is planning a month-long trip to Papua New Guinea in September to check Scripture for two more languages - the Malei book of Psalms and the Yamap gospel of Luke. Ensuring the quality of the translation of these books will take months of preparation. Working with the Yamap will be a milestone in Steve's career as a consultant. Yamap will be the 50th translation team that he has worked with to ensure the quality of their Scripture!

Steve has also been working on a project called Translator's Notes, which are translation guidebooks in easy English for teams working throughout the world. He is assigned to the book of Exodus. This work involves digging deeply into multiple commentaries, explaining the meaning of the text in simple English, and providing examples of valid ways to express the meaning.

Carol Jean continues to serve Wycliffe's mobilization team as an administrative assistant. The mobilization team works to Inspire, Inform, Educate, and Invite people to join the ministry of Bible translation. They reach out through online and in-person events to help people see how God might use them to reach Bibleless people with His Word. Her role includes coordinating communication with students and alumni at hundreds of colleges, helping mobilizers promote jobs and events.

Praise God for:

- the newly checked Scripture in the Etulo language.
- contacts that Wycliffe is making with potential new workers for Bible translation.

Please pray for:

- the Etulo team and community as they print, record, distribute, and use their newly checked Scripture portions.
- good progress on Translator's Notes for Exodus.
- preparations for Steve's upcoming trip to PNG.
- Wycliffe's mobilization team as they plan and conduct various events and that more people will join the Bible translation movement.
- more people to join our under-staffed mobilization team, as well as the work of Bible translation in general.

Our mission statement is to Glorify God, providing sustainable community services to Nigeria, specifically the Mambila Plateau with the intent and purpose of advancing the kingdom of God through the demonstration

of compassion and the love of God in the lives of its staff.

Greetings from Gembu!
Not having the Duty
Waver, we left our home
in Pine River on January
11 and got our Covid test.
January 12th, we headed
to the Minneapolis airport
for a flight to Chicago. At



the airport we found that Dan's Covid test from the day before was dated for January 7. Fortunately, we arrived at the airport with plenty of time to correct the error.

We next headed to Frankfurt, Germany. After a two-hour layover, we headed to Abuja. Over Africa, the pilot came on the loudspeaker and said that the navigation system on the plane had gone down. In Europe, he was able to navigate from ground towers, but in Africa was flying blind. We were going back to Italy, wait for a plane then go back to Frankfurt. After 11 hours on the plane, we were back to where we started. At, 7:00 am next day we boarded the plane to Abuja. We arrived at Abuja around 6 p.m. on January 15, were picked up at the airport and taken to a new missionary's home. We stayed with the Patrick's a young couple serving in Abuja.

On January 19 we took the flight from Abuja to Jalingo. It was too late when we arrived in Jalingo to safely drive to Gembu so we spent the night at a hotel. The next morning, we left and made it to our home on January 20 about 1:30 pm.

We found things moving forward and our staff has done an amazing job! Our new partnership with Christian Blind Mission is already working on training and empowering Cameroonian refugees, vulnerable, and disabled members of our community. Each of the different areas here on the compound and ministry has had challenges and has handled them with grace and good decisions. We are very proud of how our leadership team has progressed and the growth in so many areas!

We still do not have the duty waiver, please continue to pray that it comes in the timing that God wants. We have decided that we will plan to pack the container after that is received. On our first full day in Gembu, our vet came to check on Lady and I talked to him about getting a new Russian Shepherd puppy to replace Tramp who was poisoned. Much to my surprise, a few days later Lionel joined our family. He is a clumsy, cute, large-footed puppy that will grow into a wonderful guard dog! We are thankful for him!

It is Harmattan season here so the weather is cooler in the morning and evening, around 50 degrees and the wind and dust are blowing everywhere. There won't be any rain likely again until March. We are enjoying the change from the snowy, 30 degrees below zero weather when we left Minnesota.

They have been Bringing healing, reconciliation & unity to the church for the past 25 years.

We continue in the role of mentoring the pastors, and it is a joy and blessing to see

how well the church is doing. The new Nicaraguan assistant pastors are finding their rhythm and niche in meeting the growing needs of the church. A young man we invested much prayer and time into while we lived in Jinotega is now overseeing the children's feeding program. We are so grateful to see fruit of our labors, lives changed through God's love and the power of His Word. We thank you, Christian Campers, for your financial support and prayers that helped raise up this church!

We also started landscaping our backyard. Our home is a gathering place, where we pray for

people, teach seminars and host conferences. We have desired for some time to have something besides boulders and dirt in the back yard. We have made good progress on developing 2 green sitting areas with plants and flowers, so groups can enjoy beauty when they split into threes and fours for prayer during break-out sessions. We have some type of gathering at least once a week, and since we have summer all year long, we are really happy to finally get a start on this project.

Our yard project, out of necessity, ended up being greatly expanded. The weak 50 year old brick wall between our property and the business next door needed to be torn down and rebuilt. It is no longer in danger of falling and causing damage. We're thankful to have it done.

Earl is part of a prayer mobilization project that extends around the globe; the world desperately needs to know the Saviour.

Bev has continued teaching seminars on inner healing to women. She's now finished the series with several groups of women. In addition to the teaching, she often spends considerable time praying with each individual.

Beverly is preparing an update on their activities that we can share at the May camping weekend. Here is an email from her on April 28th:

Good evening Loren,

I'm sorry I keep getting interrupted when working on our newsletter. Things in addition to our normal ministry schedule happen— like unexpected visitors, emergency counseling sessions with suicidal people, visiting desperate families who live out in the country.

Earl has been traveling to several cities around Nicaragua the past few weeks. I will be hopefully finally finish our newsletter this week, but I'm not sure if that will be soon enough to make it into your May newsletter. I will get it to you as soon as possible.
